I want to thank all the writers, poets, theologians, teachers, preachers, etc., whom I have ever read or heard for enriching my thoughts and preaching, such as Marcus Borg, Richard Rohr, C.S. Lewis, N.T. Wright, and many others. I apologize if I have missed anyone, and I appreciate all these resources, inspirations, and influences on my preaching.
